The fraternity jewel is the ruby. The fraternity colour is cardinal. The fraternity flower is the Jacqueminot Rose. The fraternity philanthropy is Arthritis Research.

AOII has no insignia or crest. The founders reasoned that the Fraternity should adhere to ancient Greek ideals. It was different people in a later time – the middle ages - that produced crests, shields, and other symbols of herald. We are truly Greek.
